As part of its social outreach programme, Sembawang adopted MWH in May 2012 and has partnered with the Home through various avenues, such as providing internship opportunities for MWH residents and retrofitting the Home. Sembawang also revamped the home's facilities and created a new learning hub by fitting four classrooms with brand-new equipment and educational material. The Learning Hub @ MWH aims to provide a conducive environment to learn and excel in the hope that young residents will secure a better future for themselves and become contributing members of society.

This year, in the continuous spirit of giving back and investing towards the future of younger generations, Sembawang initiated a fund-raising campaign. The campaign included a charity pledge card and a charity art auction event, which was held in the evening at the MWH premises.

The art pieces auctioned during the charity art fundraiser event were original works by the residents. Partners and guests at the event were given the opportunity to support MWH's art programme by bidding on the residents' art pieces.

Sembawang raised a total of more than S\$65,500 for the Home through its fund-raising initiative: S\$23,538 from pledge card donations, S\$19,400 outright donations from its partners and S\$22,600 from the art auction. Funds raised from this event will go towards MWH's tuition programme, which aims to guide and motivate the residents to excel academically.

A shelter and rehabilitation centre for youths at risk, MWH is now in its 24th year of serving the community. Currently housing a total of 60 residents, the Home cares for a mix of juvenile delinquent cases, Beyond Parental Control cases and those based on compassionate grounds. The residents are usually referred by Juvenile Courts and the Ministry of Social and Family Development, also formerly known as the Ministry of Community, Youth and Sports, and they undergo a rehabilitation programme for 1 to 3 years.

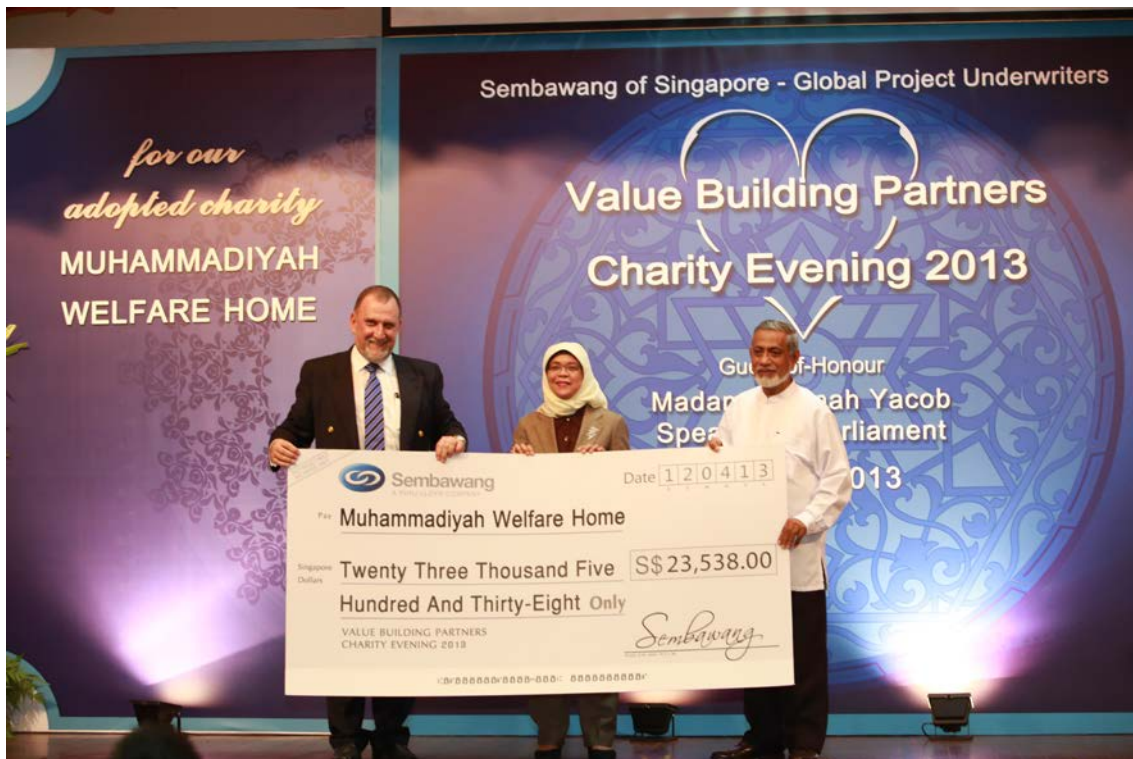
